

**Garvestone Primary School**  
**PE and Sport Premium Funding**  
**Financial Year 2016/2017**

The government gives extra funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money. For example, the funding can be used to:

- Hire specialist PE teachers
- Hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- Provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs.
- Run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- Run sports activities with other schools

**How will we spend the PE & Sports Funding and who will benefit?**

The Governors of Garvestone Primary School agree that the money must be used so that: all children benefit regardless of sporting ability; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development and to assist in the development of the sports curriculum across the school.

## 2016/2017

For the financial year 2016/2017 Garvestone Primary School received was £8240 of PE & Sports Funding.

The following table illustrates how we spent the PE & Sports Funding in 2016/2017.

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A balance of £1,560– unspent in 2016/2017 – is carried over to £2017/2018

This will be added to the £16,500 we shall receive for 2017/18. Governors are currently discussing the best use of this funding.
